Federal/Special Education Programs – Dr. Van Deusen provided information about the successful Title I audit, the amount allotted to Cocalico through the Ready to Learn grant, and the Pre-K Counts review that is scheduled for later this month.

Superintendent's Report – Dr. Melnyk provided a review of Cocalico School District's Annual Academic Report. Cocalico students are exceeding the state average on PSSA, Keystone Exams, Advanced Placement exams and SAT and ACT exams. Ms. Seltzer highlighted fall sports results including the many students who achieved Academic All-Star status, coaches who were awarded Coach of the Year status (Chip Kappasser, Ron Derr, Derek Sipe), and teams that won the LL League Championship (Golf, Boys' Cross Country). Mrs. Marley listed the many ways in which Cocalico parents, students, and staff donated money to the Cocalico Education Foundation during the Extraordinary Give, with a total collection of over \$15,000. Dr. Musser shared information about students qualifying to participate in District and National chorus opportunities, provided information about the Community Advisory Forum held last week, and expressed appreciation to Mr. John Lorah and Mr. Barry Harting for the many years of dedicated service they have provided to the Cocalico School District.

General Comments – Mr. Graybill and Mr. Dissinger thanked Mr. Lorah & Mr. Harting for their many years of service. Mr. Harting commended students, teachers, administrators, the Superintendent, and School Board members for the success of the Cocalico School District.
