IU #13 Report – Mr. Dissinger handed out the newsletter and shared a report about district participation in I.U.#13 programs and events.

Federal/Special Education Programs – Dr. Van Deusen presented an approval letter from PDE regarding our Title I program's Maintenance of Effort (for successfully supplementing rather than supplanting our regular education program with the Title I services we offer).

Superintendent's Report – Dr. Musser and Mrs. Marley expressed condolences for the family of Lori High and shared some of the many ways in which Lori has impacted the Cocalico School District over her many years as a student, parent, and employee of the district. Dr. Melynk provided an update of our performance results on PSSA, Keystone Exams, NOCTI Exams, AP Exams, SAT and ACT Exams. He also presented information about the Future Ready Index and what is shared with the public about our students' performance. Dr. Haldeman provided an update on the successful start of our Head Start program and the students that are being served through this program. Miss Seltzer presented highlights from the fall sports season, including: Cross Country League Medalists (Evan Kreider and Max McCormack), Girls Golf League Champion (Ammala Mou), Boys' Soccer League Champions, Girls' Soccer League Sportsmanship Award, Girls' Tennis League Sportsmanship Award, and Football's District Championship game on Friday. Mrs. Marley shared information about the Extra Give and the funds that were raised (nearly \$19,000) through this event. Dr. Musser congratulated the following students: Rebecca Gideon for being selected for PMEA District 7 Chorus, Corrine Fair for being selected for the PA Attorney General's "Drug Free" calendar

contest, Thomas Denlinger, Daniel Frederick and Jamie Zamrin for being named AP Scholars with Honor (having earned scores of 3 or higher on four or more AP exams), and Katie Carrasco, Daniel Shupp, and Abigail Smaltz for being named AP Scholars with Distinction (having earned scores of 3 or higher on five or more AP exams). Dr. Musser also provided information about the Eagle P.A.C.T. community forum, Career Day at the Middle School, parent/teacher conference at the Elementary and Middle School level, and upcoming holiday concert dates.

General Comments – A resident in attendance asked what the district is doing to improve Middle School math scores. Dr. Musser replied.

The meeting was then recessed until December 3, 2018 at 7:30 p.m. for the purpose of Board Reorganization.
