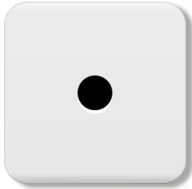


BEFORE YOU READ DICE GAME

Why did you pick this book?



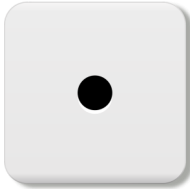
Do you think you will like this book based off the cover and title? Explain why.

What happens at the beginning, the middle, and the end of this story?



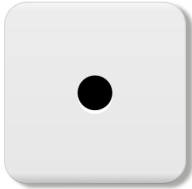
What was the main problem or challenge that the main character faced in this story?

What was the most interesting part of this book? Explain why.



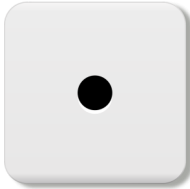

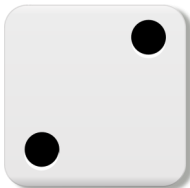
